The 2018 edition includes important information on how the Passage of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act as well as recent changes to New Jersey estate tax law (N.J.S.A. 54:38-1 et seq.) affect various estates, as well as a section on taking your digital assets into consideration and new *Frequently Asked Questions* regarding a POLST Form and a Funeral Agent, both of which have been brought up by local residents in meetings throughout the County.

Before this edition, the most recent upgrade in 2015 included four additional sections on Federal Estate Tax, Frequently Asked Questions, Outreach, and The History of the Court. These editions also include an important clarification in the matter of executor commissions in the State of New Jersey stating that “executor commissions are only allowable on ‘probate assets’ and on real estate which comes into the hands of the executor.”
